Did You Know?

Over 150 agencies in Missouri are approved to receive goods and services through the Festival of Sharing. Agencies have gone through an application process identifying their clientele, services provided, criteria for assistance and more. Once approved by the Coordinating Committee, an agency is welcome to receive goods and services for as long as needed.

Agency partners include food pantries, clothes closets, foster and adoption programs, community gardens, and resource centers. Their staff, volunteers and advocates work diligently to provide resources for healthy, successful lives. Each summer they are invited to submit requests for kits and packs to be picked up at the Sharefests. While the needs are different around the state, often the most-requested kits are personal hygiene, family food and paper products.

Distributing the kits through the Sharefests is one way Festival of Sharing church partners work collectively in love and humble service. Agency recipients continuously express how grateful they are for donations, volunteers and prayers which help make their work possible.

These packs are for youth ages 12-18 who have experienced a crisis and who have been placed in state care or are experiencing homelessness.

Note: To make distribution easier, we ask that you try to make kits as gender neutral as possible and donate money for us to add the body spray and feminine items as they are distributed. We request a \$3 donation to be sent to our office for us to purchase body spray and feminine items to be added to the kits as they are handed out.

Donation

Our prayer is to offer hygiene items to promote dignity and cleanliness and express our support for continued healing. A small kit containing shampoo, lotion, deodorant, toothpaste and an emery board can make a significant impact. For some individuals in correctional facilities, outside relationships with friends or family might be a source of social and financial support. At the correctional facility in Vandalia, MO, financial resources can be used to purchase higher quality items from the facility's market. For those without supplemental finances, basic items are provided by the state.

We invite you to fundraise money (\$10 per pack) and send it to the Festival of Sharing office where we will buy approved supplies in bulk. You can arrange for a day to visit our warehouse and assemble the packs. This streamlines the process and ensures the correct items are given.

Please do not include monetary gifts in kits or boxes. All cash gifts should be turned into Festival Office or Sharefest attendent.



Kit and Pack Boxing Instructions



BOX

Sturdy boxes with lids (banana, egg and copy paper boxes) work best. Please include only one type of kit in each box to avoid confusion and extra sorting time. Do not make boxes heavier than 20 lbs.



LABEL

Mark each box, both top and side, with what type of kit it is and the number enclosed. Clearly label if it's Missouri or CWS. Please use a felt-tip marker, like a Sharpie, for easier reading.



TAPE

Secure the box with reinforced tape, so the contents are not accidentally dropped, damaged or soiled.

- 1, pair of blunt metal scissors (rounded tip)
- 1, 30-cm ruler (12 inch)
- 6, new unsharpened pencils with erasers (remove packaging)

- 1 large eraser (no pencil cap erasers)
- 1 box of 24 ct. crayons (only 24)

Instructions: Place all items in a one-gallon sized plastic bag, remove air and seal. All items must be new. Do not enclose personal notes, money or extra items.



Instructions: Place all items in a 1-gallon plastic bag with zipper closure, remove excess air from bag and seal. Please do not add toothpaste to the hygiene kit. Cartons that have an extended expiration date will be added to each kit prior to shipment. Place kits in sturdy boxes and label "CWS Hygiene Kits" and the number of kits included.

WORKING TOGETHER, MAKING AN IMPACT

Festival of Sharing has long been an opportunity for people of various backgrounds



to collectively respond to hunger and poverty in Missouri and beyond. In 2023, **300** volunteers donated over **1,500** hours of time to the **seven** Sharefest events across the state. This time was spent packing hygiene and dental kits, assembling paper product packs and food boxes, tying fleece blankets, packaging rice, unloading and loading vehicles, counting and sorting kits, praying over gifts, greeting volunteers, and learning about the work agencies do.

While the work occurring at the Sharefests is integral in making this cooperative ministry happen, equally important are the hours spent preparing and gathering resources throughout the year. Early on, churches and groups begin thinking about what kits they want to focus on and sites start discussing the logistics of the events.



It's important to recognize that while churches of all sizes participate in Festival of Sharing, a significant portion of the efforts are supported by churches in our more rural or smaller communities. In 2023, **65**% of participating churches represented communities of 5,000 or less and their donations accounted for **75**% of non-cash gifts (packs and kits) collected at the Sharefests.

It is clear God is at work through these congregations and their collective efforts towards something bigger have an impact beyond what can be put into words. Festival of Sharing is grateful for the combined gifts, talents, time, and prayers that provide hope and love to agencies and all those they serve.

The Festival of Sharing hosts an annual quilt auction to raise funds for the Church World Service Blanket program, www.cwsblankets.org, which helps people rebuild their lives after difficult times. The 2023 auction was held online and folks were invited to bid on 57 beautifully quilted items. Winning bidders came from California, Connecticut, Missouri, New Jersey, Pennslyvania, Rhode Island and Virginia. Proceeds for Church World Service totaled \$8,634. That represents 863 blankets of hope and comfort!
